Internship Program Graduates

On Friday, July 14, more than 30 high-school students and their parents gathered at The Driving Museum in El Segundo, for a culmination event for Constitutional Rights Foundation's Expanding Horizons Internships program. Also attending the event were South Bay business leaders who support the program. Expanding Horizons Internships provides high-school juniors with a paid five-week internship and nearly 50 hours of intensive college and career preparation. During the seminars, these students enhance their communication and networking skills, learn professionalism in a work environment, engage in SAT-ACT prep, and participate in college essay writing activities. At the work site, each intern focuses on a variety of tasks provided by a supervisor. This critical work experience helps develop the students' confidence, critical thinking, and professional workplace skills to further their academic growth as they prepare for college and career.
